#### Review and Discussion of Accountability, Risk, and Compliance Department

Frank Jason Gutierrez, Director of Accountability, Risk, and Compliance presented on the Accountability, Risk, and Compliance Department.

Purpose – At the request of the Office of The President and the Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services, the Director for Accountability, Risk, and Compliance provided a presentation on the services and core functions of the Accountability, Risk, and Compliance Department.

Background – The Accountability, Risk, and Compliance Department was established September 1, 2016. The department was dedicated to supporting South Texas College through services and initiatives aimed at facilitating process improvement, accountability, risk mitigation and prevention, compliance, and reinforcing a culture of integrity.

A Power Point Presentation was prepared to share with the Finance, Human Resources, and Audit Committee an overview of the services and functions the department provides to South Texas College. The presentation detailed the essential roles of the individual departments and highlighted previous and upcoming initiatives and projects.

Enclosed Documents – The Accountability, Risk, and Compliance Department Power Point Presentation was included in the packet for the Committee's information and review.

The Committee expressed their support for the College's development and implementation of a Accountability, Risk, and Compliance department. Administration commended Mr. Gutierrez and his team on their work, which set South Texas College at the forefront of community colleges engaged in institutional efforts to promote accountability, risk management, and compliance initiatives.

No action was required from the Committee. This item was presented for information.

#### Review and Discussion of Position Vacancy Report for FY 2016 - 2017

The updated Staffing Plan Position Vacancy Report for FY 2016 - 2017 was provided in the packet for the Committee's information and review. Information was current as of February 9, 2017.

Dr. Shirley A. Reed, President, and Mrs. Mary Elizondo, Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services, were available to respond to questions from the Committee.

The presentation of the data was modified to detail the status of each position.

- Fiscal Year 2016 2017 started with 143 vacant Full Time Regular positions from the previous fiscal year, and the Board approved one hundred and sixty five (165) additional new positions for a total of 308 vacant Full Time Regular positions.
- The one hundred and fifty-two (152) Bond Construction Program related positions will be filled as needed in alignment with the building construction timeline.

# 2) Positions Filled during Fiscal Year 2016 - 2017 (EXHIBIT C - HIRED)

- Eighty nine (89) Full Time, Regular positions have been filled as of February 9, 2017.
- Eleven (11) Full Time, Regular positions have been filled since the last vacancy report provided as of January 12, 2017.

## Discussion and Action as Necessary on Hidalgo County Tax Resale Properties and Resolution Authorizing Tax Resale

Approval of the Hidalgo County Tax Resale Properties and the Resolution Authorizing the Tax Resale will be requested at the March 28, 2017, Board meeting.

Purpose – The law offices of Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP is requesting consideration and possible action on the tax resale of forty-four (44) properties.

Justification – The Texas Property Tax Code requires approval from all taxing entities for the resale of a property for an amount that is less than the appraised value on a resale auction.

Background - On February 7, 2017, Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP held a Tax Resale Auction at the Hidalgo County Clerk Records Management Facility for struck off properties located within Hidalgo County. Out of the forty-seven (47) properties, three (3) properties were denied by other taxing authorities. They are requesting Board approval on forty-four (44) properties. The tax resale auction was published in The Monitor and several other newspapers throughout Hidalgo County.

Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP is submitting for the Board of Trustees' consideration the analysis of the bids received. The total amount the College will receive is \$27,090.26.

Enclosed Documents - The Resolution Authorizing the Tax Resale follows in the packet for the Committee's review. A listing of the bids, the legal description for each property, as well as the amount of the bid, the South Texas College amount, and the Analysis of Bids Received are included under separate cover for your information and review.

A representative from Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP will be present at the meeting to address any questions by the committee.

It is requested that the Finance and Human Resources Committee recommend for Board approval at the March 28, 2017, Board meeting, the Hidalgo County Tax Resale Bids and the Resolution Authorizing the Tax Resale to Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP as presented.

#### Review and Discussion of State Appropriations for FY 2017 - 2018 and FY 2018 - 2019 Biennium

On January 18, 2017, the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) provided to South Texas College the Senate (SB1) and the House (HB1) base budget bills for the FY 2017 - 2018 and FY 2018 - 2019 biennium.

#### Preliminary Funding - All Community Colleges - Biennium FY 2018 - FY 2019

The total funding level for all the Community Colleges per SB1 and HB1 is as follows:

- Each bill maintains the current \$1,000,000 core funding for each college and the remaining amount is divided as 90% for Contact Hours and 10% for Student Success Points funding.
- For the FY 2018 FY 2019 biennium, the Contact Hour funding total for all community colleges is reduced by \$5,879,808 from the FY 2016 FY 2017 biennium, or -0.4%, and the Success Points funding total is reduced by \$653,312 from the FY 2016 FY 2017 biennium, or -0.4%. The Success Points were funded at \$185.12 per point for the FY 2014 FY 2015 biennium and \$173.00 per point for the FY 2016 FY 2017 biennium. The proposed Success Points funding for the FY 2018 FY 2019 biennium is \$162.51 per point.
- The Senate deleted all Community College Special Items, but placed a contingency amount elsewhere in the budget.
- The House reduced the Community College Special Items by 9%.
- The Senate and House deleted the Hold Harmless funding, which prevents colleges from receiving less funds in the upcoming biennium than what was received by each college in the previous biennium.

#### Review and Discussion of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Report on the Fiscal Year 2016 Financial Condition Analysis of Texas Public Community College Districts

Mrs. Mary Elizondo, Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services, will review with the Committee the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Report on the Fiscal Year 2016 Financial Condition Analysis of Texas Public Community College Districts.

Purpose – South Texas College's financial information and ratios presented in the Financial Condition Analysis of Texas Public Community College Districts, will be reviewed with the Finance Committee.

Background - The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board collects financial documents for Texas Public Institutions of higher education, including community colleges. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's annual report on the financial condition of the state's community colleges is required as referenced in the General Appropriations Act, House Bill 1 (H.B. 1), 84th Texas Legislature, Section 13 (page III-211). The rider states the following:

"Each community college shall provide to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board financial data related to the operation of each community college using the specific content and format prescribed by the Coordinating Board. Each community college shall provide the report no later than January 1st of each year.

The Coordinating Board shall provide an annual report due on May 1 to the Legislative Budget Board and Governor's Office about the financial condition of the state's community college districts."

Community college districts experienced a significant change in Accounting Principal in FY 2015 with the implementation of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) 68. According to the statement 68 summary,

"The primary objective of this Statement is to improve accounting and financial reporting by state and local governments for pensions. It also improves information provided by state and local governmental employers about financial support for pensions that is provided by other entities. This Statement results from a comprehensive review of the effectiveness of existing standards of accounting and financial reporting for pensions with regard to providing decision-useful information, supporting assessments of accountability and interperiod equity, and creating additional transparency."

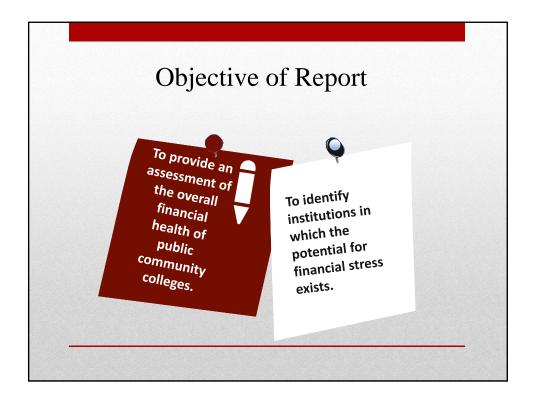
To create additional transparency, the GASB 68 implementation transferred pension liability from the state-level financial statements of the Teachers Retirement System (TRS) to the individual financial statements of the institutions. This transfer increased the visibility of pension liability at the community college district level. The overall effect to statewide financial ratios and financial condition of community college districts was substantial.

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Justification - The objective of this report is to provide an assessment of the overall financial health of public community colleges and to identify institutions in which the potential for financial stress exists.

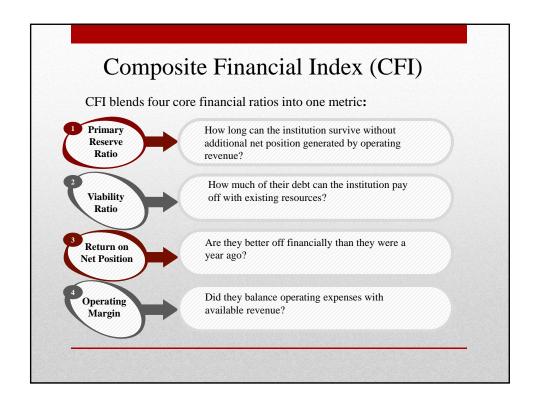

#### **Executive Summary**

The objective of this report and the accompanying Excel workbook is to provide an assessment of the overall financial health of public community colleges and to identify the potential for financial stress at specific community colleges. This analysis is intended to be a broad financial evaluation. Other key performance indicators must be taken into account to gain a more robust and complete understanding of institutional strength. This analysis is not intended for peer-group comparisons or for benchmarking purposes.

An annual report about the financial condition of the state's community colleges is required by a rider in House Bill 1, General Appropriations Act (Section 13, page III-211), 84th Texas Legislature. The rider states the following:

"Each community college shall provide to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board financial data related to the operation of each community college using the specific content and format prescribed by the Coordinating Board. Each community college shall provide the report no later than January 1st of each year.

The Coordinating Board shall provide an annual report due on May 1 to the Legislative Budget Board and Governor's Office about the financial condition of the state's community college districts."

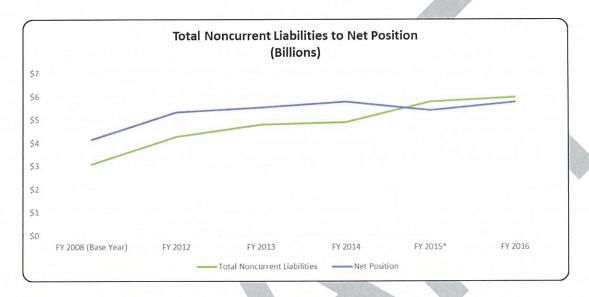
The overall financial health of an institution can be measured using two dimensions of inquiry. First, is the institution financially capable of successfully carrying out its current programs? Second, is the institution able to carry out its intended programs into the future?

Community college districts experienced a significant change in Accounting Principal in FY 2015 with the implementation of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) 68. According to the statement 68 summary,

"The primary objective of this Statement is to improve accounting and financial reporting by state and local governments for pensions. It also improves information provided by state and local governmental employers about financial support for pensions that is provided by other entities. This Statement results from a comprehensive review of the effectiveness of existing standards of accounting and financial reporting for pensions with regard to providing decision-useful information, supporting assessments of accountability and interperiod equity, and creating additional transparency."

To create additional transparency, the GASB 68 implementation transferred pension liability from the state-level financial statements of the Teachers Retirement System (TRS) to the individual financial statements of the institutions. This transfer increased the visibility of pension liability at the community college district level. The overall effect to statewide financial ratios and financial condition of community college districts was substantial and is reflected below.

For a year-to-year comparison of total noncurrent liabilities and net position, impacted amounts for GASB 68 implementation are reflected. Total noncurrent liabilities have increased \$2.89 billion since Fiscal Year (FY) 2008. Most of the increase is due to the general obligation bonds issued by districts and the addition of the Net Pension Liability in FY 2015. For FY 2016, the total noncurrent liabilities for Texas public community colleges was \$5.97 billion. Overall, Texas public community colleges are managing the growth they have experienced. Net position has increased \$2.28 billion since FY 2008 to \$6.42 billion in FY 2016.

Ratios referenced in this report are commonly used by external entities to measure the health of higher education institutions. A Composite Financial Index (CFI) has been calculated to provide one metric to efficiently analyze the financial health of all districts. Other ratios used in this analysis include an equity ratio and a leverage ratio.

The institutions were given an opportunity to provide feedback on the report no later than February 24, 2017.

#### Overview

There are 50 public community college districts in Texas, the oldest dating back to 1869. They are locally controlled governmental entities established via an election process. State statute specifies that newly created districts must have 15,000 secondary students and a minimum assessed property valuation of \$2.5 billion. Seven of the existing districts do not currently meet that standard.

To a significant degree, local control enables districts to determine their own financial destiny. State law and Coordinating Board rules impose some limitations, but local autonomy and demographics account for much of the variation in resource allocation and revenue collection.<sup>1</sup>

Community college districts have four primary funding sources: state formula funding, local property tax revenue, tuition and fee revenue, and other income that is largely from federal funds. Although some districts have endowments, they are more commonly found in universities. Revenue from endowments is most often used for tuition assistance as opposed to operations.

#### Financial Analysis in Higher Education<sup>2</sup>

The concept of using selected indicators, such as ratios, during the course of financial analysis is nothing new in higher education, dating back to at least 1980. Financial analysis can measure success against institutional objectives and provide useful information that can form a basis for sound planning.

The overall financial health of an institution can be assessed via two dimensions of inquiry. First, is the institution financially capable of successfully carrying out its current programs? Second, is the institution able to carry out its intended programs well into the future?

Along with these two dimensions, four key financial questions need to be asked:

- Are resources sufficient and flexible enough to support the mission?
- Are resources, including debt, managed strategically to advance the mission?
- Does asset performance and management support the strategic direction?
- Do operating results indicate the institution is living within available resources?

A widely accepted metric called the Composite Financial Index (CFI) is often used to address these four key questions. The index was developed over time by a consortium of consulting companies led by KPMG and introduced in 1999. Many institutions, including the U.S. Department of Education, the State of Ohio Board of Regents, credit rating agencies, and countless institutions of higher education employ the index or similar approaches.

The CFI blends four core financial ratios into one metric, providing a more balanced view of an institution's finances since weakness in one measure can be offset by strength in another. Additionally, measuring the index over time provides a glimpse of the progress institutions are making toward achieving financial goals.

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board has been calculating the CFI and sharing related data with community college districts since 2007.

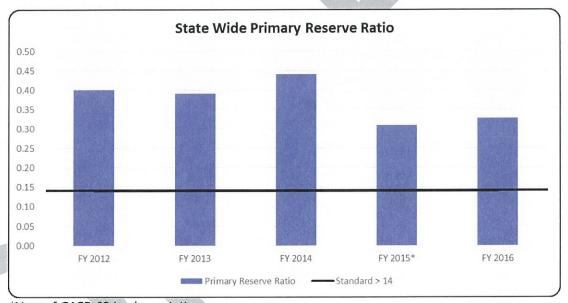
The CFI includes the following four core ratios: Primary Reserve, Viability, Return on Net Position, and Operating Margin.

**Primary Reserve Ratio** – measures financial strength and flexibility by comparing expendable net position to total expenses. This measure answers the question, "How long can the institution survive without additional net position generated by operating revenue?"

<u>Calculation</u> – Total expendable net position + unrestricted net position / operating expenses + interest expense on debt\*.

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide ratio for public community colleges is .33, which is an increase from .31 in 2015. A ratio of 0.14 or greater is the standard used in this report. The standard was met by 33 of the 50 districts.

\*Interest expense on debt includes all debt, both tax and other revenue supported.



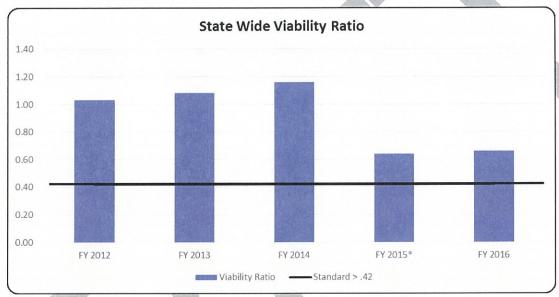

<u>Viability Ratio</u> – measures the financial health of the institution by comparing total expendable net position to total noncurrent liabilities. This ratio is similar to a coverage ratio used in the private sector to indicate the ability of an organization to cover its long-term debt and answers the question, "How much of the debt can the institution pay off with existing resources?"

<u>Calculation</u> – Total expendable net position + unrestricted net position / Noncurrent liabilities, excluding general obligation (GO) debt.

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide ratio for public community colleges is .66, which is an increase from .64 in 2015. A ratio of 0.42 or greater is the state standard, which was met by 30 of the 50 districts.



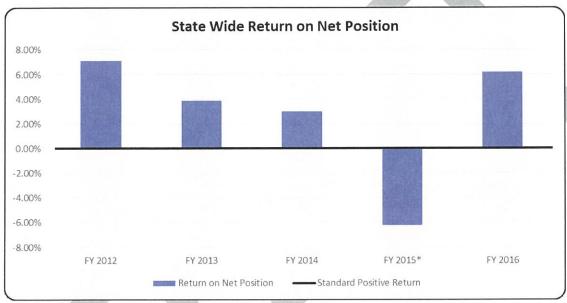

**Return on Net Position** – measures total economic return during the fiscal year. This measure is similar to the return on equity ratio used in examining for-profit concerns and answers the question, "Is the institution better off financially than it was a year ago?"

<u>Calculation</u> – Change in net position / Total net position (beginning of year)

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide ratio for public community colleges is 6.19 percent, which is an increase from -6.24 percent in 2015. A positive return is the standard used in this report and this standard was met by 39 of the 50 districts.

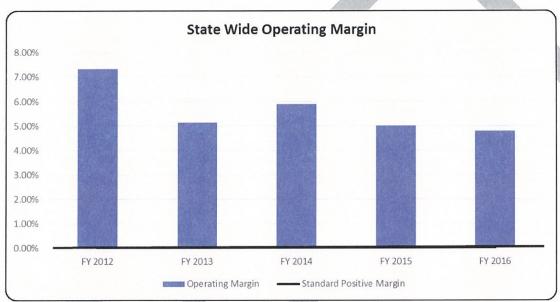

<u>Operating Margin</u> – indicates an operating surplus or deficit in the given fiscal year. This ratio is similar to a profit margin and answers the question, "Did they balance operating expenses with available revenue?" Depreciation expense is included to reflect the use of physical assets in measuring operating performance.

<u>Calculation</u> – Total income - total operating expense / Total income\*

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide margin for public community colleges is 4.78 percent, which is a decrease from 5.01 percent in 2015. A positive margin is the standard used in this report. The standard was met by 37 of the 50 districts.

\*Includes all operating revenue plus formula funding, property tax, and Title IV federal revenue.

#### **Metrics Used in This Report**

This report uses a Composite Financial Index (CFI) to provide one metric to efficiently analyze the financial health of all Texas community college districts. Other metrics used in this analysis include an equity ratio and a leverage ratio.

<u>Composite Financial Index</u> – measures the overall health of an institution by combining four ratios into one metric. The four core ratios include return on net position, operating margin, primary reserve, and viability ratio.

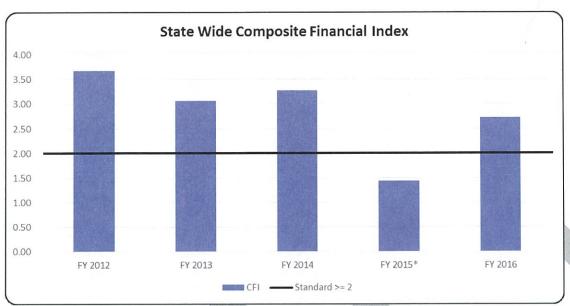
Calculation – The CFI is computed using a four-step methodology:

- 1. Computing the values of the core ratios
- 2. Calculating strength factors by dividing the core ratios by threshold values
- 3. Multiplying the factors by specific weights
- 4. Totaling the resulting scores to obtain the Composite Financial Index

Results – The 2016 combined CFI for public community colleges is 2.72, which is an increase from 1.44 in 2015 and exceeds the statewide standard of 2.0 or greater. The standard was met by 33 of the 50 districts. CFI numbers generally range from 0.00 to 10.00, although it is possible to have a CFI higher than 10.0 or below zero.

The threshold for the CFI was established by considering the original work conducted by KPMG in creating the index and industry practice. Using the CFI is the single best method to assess overall financial condition. While variability exists in the statewide CFI when looking at a year-to-year comparison, the overall financial condition of public community colleges improved in the four years prior to 2015, with the statewide CFI increasing from 2.96 in FY 2011 to 3.27 in FY 2014. FY 2016 has shown improvement from the FY 2015 GASB 68 implementation, moving back above the state standard with a statewide CFI index of 2.72.



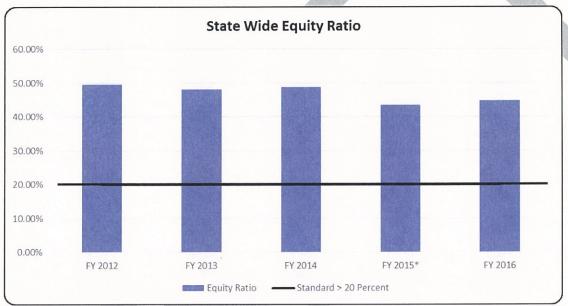

**Equity Ratio** – measures capital resources available and a college's ability to borrow. The U.S. Department of Education (DOE) introduced this ratio to enhance reporting for institutions that do not have long-term debt. The DOE uses financial ratios, in part, to provide oversight to institutions participating in programs authorized under Title IV of the Higher Education Act.

<u>Calculation</u> – Net position / Total assets

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide ratio for public community colleges is 44.8 percent, which is an increase from 43.4 percent in 2015. A ratio of 20 percent or greater is the standard used in this report. The standard was met by 47 of the 50 districts.



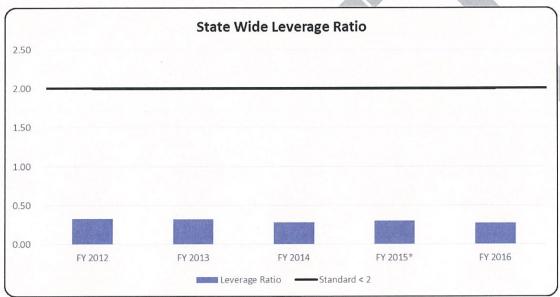

**Leverage Ratio** – measures the amount of debt in relation to net position and provides an indication of the amount of interest and principle the institution must absorb in the future. This ratio is similar to the debt-to-equity ratio used in the private sector. The leverage ratio differs from the viability ratio in that investment in physical plant assets is included as part of the numerator. Long-term debt includes bonds payable, excluding GO bonds and long-term liabilities.

#### <u>Calculation</u> – Long term debt / Total net position

<u>Results</u> – The 2016 statewide ratio for the public community colleges is .27, which is a decrease from .30 in 2015. A ratio of less than 2.0 is the standard used in this report. The standard was met by 48 of the 50 districts.

Data are reported by the institutions and came from published annual financial reports.

#### **Financial Condition**

Forty of the 50 Texas public community college districts have moderate or no indication of financial stress, which means they met four or more of the seven indicators. Twenty-four of these meet the threshold for all indicators. In FY 2015, 33 community college districts had moderate or no indication of financial stress. Currently, 10 community college districts do not meet four or more indicators, which means they could be experiencing some financial stress.

For Fiscal Year 2016, 24 community college districts met the threshold for all indicators, and 40 of the 50 Texas public community college districts show moderate or no indication of financial stress. The remaining ten, however, are worthy of additional discussion:

- Austin Community College (ACC) did not meet four of the indicator thresholds. The ratios that include total assets and noncurrent debt the equity and leverage ratios are below the standard used for this report. The college's increase of \$3.7 million in noncurrent liabilities kept the institution's viability ratio below the state standard. The college met the threshold for operating margin, return on net position, and CFI. Operating and nonoperating expenses grew by \$20.8 million, causing the primary reserve ratio to decrease below standard. On April 8, 2013, however, the rating agency Moody's gave ACC a rating of Aa1 on a bond issue and indicated the outlook for the college was stable.
- Brazosport College did not meet five of the indicator thresholds. The return on net position, operating margin, and CFI were negative. Expendable and unrestricted net position fell \$2.7 million, coupled with increased operating and nonoperating expenses and Noncurrent liabilities, lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard.
- Cisco College did not meet five of the indicator thresholds. The return on net
  position, operating margin, and CFI were negative. Expendable and unrestricted
  net position fell \$0.6 million, coupled with increased Noncurrent liabilities,
  lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard.
- Clarendon did not meet five of the indicator thresholds. The return on net position, operating margin, and CFI were negative. Expendable and unrestricted net position fell \$0.4 million, coupled with increased Noncurrent liabilities, lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard.

- Frank Phillips College did not meet five of the indicator thresholds. The return on net position, operating margin, and CFI were negative. Expendable and unrestricted net position was negative, which lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard. In the previous six years, the college has had a negative operating margin and has not met the 2.0 threshold on the CFI.
- Lee College did not meet four of the indicator thresholds. The institution's
  operating margin was negative, and the CFI is below the standard of 2.0.
  Expendable and unrestricted net position fell \$3.6 million, coupled with increased
  operating and nonoperating expenses and Noncurrent liabilities, lowered the
  primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard.
- Lone Star College did not meet four of the indicator thresholds. The institution's operating margin was negative, and the CFI is below the standard of 2.0.
   Expendable and unrestricted net position fell \$12.3 million, coupled with increased operating and nonoperating expenses and Noncurrent liabilities, lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state standard.
- McLennan did not meet four of the indicator thresholds. The institution's
  operating margin was negative, and the CFI is below the standard of 2.0. The
  institution's improvement in Expendable and unrestricted net position,
  Noncurrent liabilities, operating and nonoperating expenses was not enough to
  raise the primary reserve and viability ratios above the state standard.
- Northeast College did not meet five of the indicator thresholds. The return on net position, operating margin, and CFI were negative. The college's expendable and unrestricted net position was negative, which dropped the institution's viability and primary reserve ratios below the state standard.
- Southwest Texas College did not meet six of the indicator thresholds. The
  return on net position and CFI were negative. Expendable and unrestricted net
  position fell \$7.2 million, coupled with increased operating and nonoperating
  expenses, lowered the primary reserve and viability ratios below the state
  standard. Lower Net Position and Total Assets dropped the institution's Equity
  ratio below the state standard, while the leverage ratio remained the same as
  the previous year.

### Summary

Evaluating the overall state financial health of community colleges in regards to individual indicators is more turbulent, and the individual indicators are better used to assess an individual institution, either for a given year or on a longitudinal assessment. However, looking at the individual indicators on an aggregate basis is not without value, despite the year-to-year variability. As seen in the table below, FY 2016 saw 32 of 50 districts meeting five or more individual indicators of financial health. The other 18 districts did not meet three or more indicators.

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### Discussion of Texas Comptroller of Public Account's Transparency Stars Program Awards

The College has earned three (3) Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts' Transparency Stars Program Awards. The Business Office staff completed the requirements to earn the following Transparency Star Program Awards.

- 1. Traditional Finance Transparency Star
- 2. Economic Development Transparency Star
- 3. Debt Obligation Transparency Star

As of February, South Texas College was the only college to be awarded any of the new Transparency Stars Awards.

Background – The Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts launched a revised and improved Transparency award program in March 2016 by announcing the new Transparency Stars Program. The purpose of the program is to recognize cities, counties, and school districts going above and beyond in their transparency efforts. The program recognizes entities that accomplish the following:

 Provide clear and meaningful financial information not only by posting financial documents, but also through summaries, visualizations, downloadable data and other relevant information.

Local government entities can apply for stars in the following areas:

- Traditional Finances
- Economic Development
- Debt Obligations
- Contracts and Procurement
- Public Pensions

After receiving an initial star for Traditional Finances, remaining stars may be awarded in any order.

The College is ineligible for the Public Pension Transparency Star, due to the College participating in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas' defined benefit plan, and has limited independent decision-making.

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### Review and Discussion of Internal Audit Reports in the Areas of Mileage Reimbursement and Employment Eligibility Verification Form I-9

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Mileage Reimbursement Procedures Audit was included on the Finance, and Human Resources Committee's approved FY 2016 Audit Plan. The audit included a review of South Texas College's employee mileage reimbursement procedures including compliance with the Travel Office's *Employee Travel Guide*, and Manual of Policy 5700 *Official Travel of Employees*.

The objective of the audit was to evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls over employee mileage expense reimbursements. The audit scope included activity from September 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016.

The audit generally conformed to guidelines set forth by the Institute of Internal Auditor's *International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing* and South Texas College's Manual of Policy 5460 *Internal Audit Function*.

Overall, the Travel Office established an adequate system of internal controls over employee mileage expense reimbursements. However, the following was identified as an opportunity to further strengthen controls.

• 33 out of 50 (66%) of the files tested did not submit the Employee In-District Mileage Reimbursement and Authorization form to the Travel Office timely (e.g. prior to the semester for faculty or prior to the fiscal year for all other staff).

#### **BACKGROUND**

As part of the Accounts Payable department, the Travel Office's goal is to provide dependable and timely service to South Texas College faculty, staff and students involved in business related travel. The Travel Office performs functions such as reimbursement of incurred travel expenses and the payment of conference registration fees on behalf of the individual, group and/or student travelers. The Travel Office also assists travelers with monetary and policy questions. Total employee travel mileage expense reimbursements within the 9 month scope (September 1, 2015 - May 31, 2016) totaled \$279,965.92. Details on the total employee mileage expense reimbursements over the last two fiscal years are summarized in the table below:

#### **AUDIT OBJECTIVE**

The objective of the audit was to evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls over employee mileage expense reimbursements.

### **AUDIT SCOPE & METHODOLOGY**

The Internal Auditor evaluated the Travel Office's internal controls over employee mileage expense reimbursements. The audit scope included activity from September 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. To accomplish the audit objective, the Internal Auditor performed the following procedures:

- Interviewed management and employees on travel reimbursement internal controls and procedures;
- Reviewed the Travel Office's Employee Travel Guide;
- Reviewed the State of Texas Travel Allowance Guide;
- Reviewed Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Publication 463 *Travel, Entertainment, Gift, and Car Expenses 2015*;
- Verified that the rate of employee mileage expense reimbursement was appropriate as compared to IRS Publication 463;



- Selected a sample of employee who received mileage expense reimbursements and verified compliance with the Travel Office's *Employee Travel Guide* and Manual of Policy 5700 *Official Travel of Employees*.
- Verified that employee mileage expense reimbursement were supported by adequate documentation;
- Verified the accuracy of mileage expense reimbursements by recalculating the distance traveled and multiplying by that year's applicable rate;
- Compared employee mileage logs to South Texas College's 2015 *Mileage Chart*.

The audit generally conformed to guidelines set forth by the Institute of Internal Auditor's *International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing* and South Texas College's Manual of Policy 5460 *Internal Audit Function*.

#### **AUDIT RESULTS**

A sample of 50 mileage expense reimbursement transactions were selected for testing. The selected transactions totaled \$59,577.90 and represented approximately 21% of the entire population's cost.

### **Review and Approval**

Current procedures require that an employee's immediate supervisor approve each mileage reimbursement request. The Internal Auditor verified that each mileage expense reimbursement was supported by documentation that included an immediate supervisor's review and approval as well as a stated 'purpose of travel.' Procedures also require that Travel Office employees review mileage expenses and compare those costs to other potentially less expensive travel alternatives. Specifically, they are required to compare the costs of reimbursing employees for mileage versus the cost of air fare or other reasonable transportation. The Internal Auditor was able to verify the travel expense comparison reviews were taking place. No exceptions were noted in this area.

### **Documentation**

'Employee In-District Mileage Reimbursement and Authorization' (Travel Authorization) forms along with mileage logs were provided to support each travel expense reimbursement selected for testing. Additional documentation was also provided, including vehicle insurance cards, faculty teaching assignments, e-mails from department chairs, and local school district calendars. Adequate documentation was available to support each of the tested mileage expense reimbursements.

However, the audit found that 33 out of 50 (66%) employees' receiving mileage expense reimbursements did not submit their Travel Authorization forms timely. Additionally, the audit found that in 6% of the tested transactions, support documentation was provided in a subsequent fiscal year from when the travel expenses were actually incurred. While the Travel Office does not issue payment of mileage expense reimbursements until after all support documentation is received, current procedures require that employees requesting reimbursement for mileage, submit an approved Travel Authorization form prior to the beginning of the semester or prior to the beginning of the fiscal year.

### **Recommendation:**

1. The Travel Office should implement a process for communicating current mileage reimbursement travel procedures to Financial Managers and supervisors and follow-up with Financial Managers and supervisors who submit mileage expense support documentation after-the-fact.

### **Management Response:**

1. The Business Office conducts regular Financial Managers and Administrative Assistant Round-Up training sessions and an annual Business Office "How to Session" where travel procedures are reviewed in detail. The Business Office will strengthen communication to all employees by publishing a College-Wide Alert Notice every fall and spring semester related to the "Mileage Reimbursement Best Practices." The Business Office will notify the appropriate Financial Manager and the employee's supervisor of any noncompliance.

### CONCLUSION

Overall, the Travel Office established an adequate system of internal controls over employee mileage expense reimbursements. The audit identified one opportunity to improve internal controls relating to the timely submission of support documentation.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9 Audit was included on the Finance, and Human Resources Committee's approved FY 2016 Audit Plan. The audit included a review of the completion and retention of the Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9 as required by Manual of Policy 4210 *Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986*.

In 1986, Congress reformed U.S. immigration laws. These reforms sought to preserve the tradition of legal immigration while attempting to close the door to illegal entry. Employment is often the reason for individuals to reside in the United States illegally. The purpose of the employer sanctions law is to remove the prospect of employment to illegal aliens and require employers to hire only individuals who may legally work in the United States.

In order to comply with the law, employers must verify the identity and employment authorization of each person they hire, complete and retain an Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9, and refrain from discrimination against individuals on the basis of national origin or citizenship.

The objective of the audit was to evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of the College's internal controls over the completion and retention of Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9. The scope included activity from September 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. The audit generally conformed to guidelines set forth by the Institute of Internal Auditor's *International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing* and South Texas College's Manual of Policy 5460 *Internal Audit Function*.

Overall, the department established an adequate system of internal controls over the completion and retention of Employment Eligibility Verification forms. However, the following opportunities to enhance and strengthen controls were identified.

- A procedure was not in place to substantiate that employee's 'List of Acceptable Documents' were returned to them as required by the Employment Eligibility Verification form;
- 1 out of 35 (3%) tested employee files did not complete the I-9 within three business days of hire;
- 1 out of 35 (3%) tested employee files was missing the Employment Eligibility Verification form.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Public Law 99-603 (Act of 11/6/86), otherwise referred to as the Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA) of 1986 was passed in order to control and deter illegal immigration. IRCA provisions require that employers ensure that all newly hired employees provide valid documentation supporting their identity and legal authorization to work. Employers must complete and retain the Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9 to document verification of the identity and employment authorization of each new employee (both citizen and noncitizen) hired after November 6, 1986, to work in the United States.

The law requires that employers verify the identity and employment authorization of individuals they hire to prevent the unlawful hiring, recruiting, or referring for a fee, of aliens who are not authorized to work in the United States. Submission of the information required by the I-9 is voluntary for any potential employees, however the failure of the employer to ensure proper completion of I-9 forms, or for knowingly employing individuals unauthorized to work in the United States may subject the employer to civil and/or criminal penalties. Any person wishing to complete an I-9 form for employment eligibility verification purposes is required to attest, under penalty of perjury, that they fall into one of the categories listed below.

- United States citizen;
- Noncitizen nationals of the United States;
- Lawful permanent residents; and
- Aliens who have been authorized to work

Employers are required to retain completed Employment Eligibility Verification forms for as long as the individual works for the employer and for a period of either 3 years after the date of hire or 1 year after the date employment ended, whichever is later. Completed I-9s are not required to be filed with any government agency, however employers are required to retain the forms and make them available for inspection by authorized officials of the Department of Homeland Security, Department of Labor, and Office of Special Counsel for Immigration-Related Unfair Employment Practices.

### **AUDIT OBJECTIVE**

The objective of the audit was to evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of the College's internal controls over the completion and retention of Employment Eligibility Verification form I-9.

#### **AUDIT SCOPE & METHODOLOGY**

To accomplish the audit objective, the Internal Auditor performed the following procedures:

- Interviewed management and employees on internal controls and procedures;
- Reviewed South Texas College Manual of Policy 4210 *Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986*;
- Reviewed the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986;
- Reviewed the 'Handbook for Employers Guidance for Completing form I-9' distributed by Department of Homeland Security U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services;
- Reviewed the instructions for employment eligibility verification requirements on form I-9 and compared to Human Resources' processes for propriety;

The scope included activity from September 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. The audit generally conformed to guidelines set forth by the Institute of Internal Auditor's *International Standards* for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing and South Texas College's Manual of Policy 5460 Internal Audit Function.

#### **AUDIT RESULTS**

### Form I-9 Section 1: Employee Information and Attestation

Employers must ensure that employees complete section 1 of form I-9 no later than the first day of employment. Employees may complete section 1 of form I-9 before the first day of employment, however the employer may not begin the I-9 process until a job offer is provided to an individual and he/she accepts the offer.

Prior to 2013, Human Resources (HR) sent job offers to employees via e-mail. This process was not ideal for documenting the date that a job offer is accepted, as the e-mails were not always maintained. In 2013, HR implemented a candidate applicant tracking system called 'PeopleAdmin' which records the exact date that a job offer is made and when it is accepted. The internal auditor found that in each of the tested files' the I-9s were appropriately completed subsequent to the employee accepting a job offer. Additionally, in each of the files reviewed the I-9 form was completed either prior to or on the first day of employment. No exceptions were noted in this area.

### Form I-9 Section 2: Employer or Authorized Representative Review and Verification

Employers must complete section 2 of form I-9 each time a hire is made. The employee must present document(s) that show his or her identity and employment authorization within three (3)



business days of the date employment begins. Prospective employees must be allowed to choose which document(s) he or she wants to present from the 'List of Acceptable Documents' which appears on the last page of form I-9. The 'List of Acceptable Documents' includes:

- <u>List 'A'</u> documents that establish both identity and employment authorization;
- <u>List 'B'</u> documents that establish identity only, or;
- <u>List 'C'</u> documents which establish employment authorization only.

Employers are required to review the completion of section 1, review the employee's employment eligibility document(s) and fully complete section 2 of form I-9 within three (3) business days of hire. 1 out of 35 (3%) tested employee files did not complete the I-9 within three business days of hire as required. This occurrence was discovered by Human Resources and additional support documentation was included in the employee's file to document the details which led to the delay in completing the I-9 process within the 3 business day timeframe.

Additionally, employers are required to return employment verification documentation to prospective employees. Human Resources has not yet developed a process to support that employment verification documentation is returned to prospective employees. As a result, the internal auditor was unable to verify that this requirement was met.

### **Recommendation:**

1. The Director of Human Resources should develop a process to substantiate that employment verification documentation has been returned to each employee.

### **Management Response:**

1. There are no instructions on the I-9 form that requires confirmation when documents are returned to employees; guidance in the USCIS Handbook for Employers is as follows: "Return the original documents to your employee when you are finished."

Although there has not been any complaints that documents provided for I-9 purposes have not been returned directly to the employee; to ensure there is an audit trail, an acknowledgement of return, initialed by employee, will be incorporated into the new hire paperwork process to document return of I-9 documentation provided.

### **Implementation Date:**

March 1, 2017

### Form I-9 Section 3: Reverification and Rehires

When an employee's employment authorization document expires, the employer must verify his or her employment authorization no later than the date employment authorization expires. The employee must present a document that shows current employment authorization. If the employee cannot provide proof of current employment authorization, the institution cannot continue to employ that person. 5 out of 35 (14%) of files selected for testing were required to complete section 3. The internal auditor found that section 3 was appropriately completed in each instance. No exceptions were noted in this area.

### **Form I-9 Retention**

South Texas College must retain an employee's completed form I-9 for as long as the individual works for the college. Once an individual's employment has terminated, their I-9 must be retained for a period of either three (3) years after the date of hire, or one (1) year after the date employment is terminated, whichever is later. The forms may be retained on paper or electronically. 1 out of 35 (3%) tested employee files was missing the Employment Eligibility Verification form. With the exception of the one missing file, each of the files selected for testing was appropriately supported by an Employment Eligibility Verification form.

### **Recommendation:**

2. Periodic reviews of employee files should be conducted to ensure that all required documentation is retained in accordance with applicable regulations.

### **Management Response:**

2. The Office of Human Resources conducts periodic reviews within the Office of Human Resources of I-9 documentation to ensure compliance with laws and regulations. An extensive review was conducted July 2014 and additional periodic reviews were conducted on a random basis in FY 2015 and FY 2016. Staff have also attended various trainings and webinars to keep abreast of and maintain knowledge of federal regulations and standards and to comply with federal changes to I-9 form and processes. Another internal audit review of these processes will be requested in two years.

February 22, 2017

### CONCLUSION

Overall, The Office of Human Resources established an adequate system of internal controls over employment eligibility verification forms. Opportunities to strengthen internal controls exist related to ensuring that I-9s are completed within 3 business days of employment; establishing a process for substantiating that each employees' employment verification documentation is returned to them; and ensuring that all I-9s are retained in accordance with established regulations.
